Is It Good For The Children?

Yes - The anticipated energy efficiency improvement projects for residential, commercial, industrial, and institutional buildings will help building owners lower theier utility bills, reduce energy use and greenhouse gas emissions, improve regional air quality, and contribute to a cleaner, healthier environment for children.

How will this contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?

EnergyWorks KC will reduce energy consumption in participating neighborhoods (the Green Impact Zone and six other neighborhoods - Winnwood Sunnybrook, Central Industrial District, Washington Wheatley, Westside, Ruskin Heights and Eastwood Hills) within the next 36 months and into the future, support training and local employment in "green jobs", support healthier indoor environments in homes and businesses, and leverage these activities to achieve broader reductions in energy usage throughout the entire city and metropolitan area.

The US Department of Energy (DOE) and the City expect EnergyWorks KC to create a sustainable model for promoting energy efficiency upgrades citywide and across the metropolitan area that will continue beyond the time period of the grant when federal funding through this grant has been exhausted.

The three pillars of sustainability are: social equity (people), the environment (place), and economic opportunity (prosperity). A crucial element of creating a sustainable model, therefore, is expanding opportunities in the energy efficiency market for small, minority- and women-owned businesses. This contract is focused on moving toward sustainability in the Kansas City metropolitan region.
