Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this design professional services project to improve distribution system reliability, increase hydraulic conveyance capacity, and support fire protection.

Contract Summary/Project Description

This project includes the replacement of approximately 22,230 linear feet (LF) of 2-inch, 4-inch, 6-inch, 8-inch, 10-inch, 16-inch, and 24-inch water mains in the area of Grandview Road to Lee's Summit Road, Gregory Boulevard to Longview Road, in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

The project will replace the water mains in the following areas:

- Replace 850 LF of 6-inch clean-in place (CIP) water main with 8-inch ductile in place (DIP) along East 114th Street between Sycamore Terrace and the intersection of East 114th Terrace and East 114th Street;
- Replace 1,420 LF of 4-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along East 99th Terrace between Richmond Avenue and Tullis Avenue;
- Replace 820 LF of 6-inch and 8-inch CIP with 8-inch DIP along Donnelly Avenue between East 98th Terrace and East 97th Terrace;
- Replace 870 LF of 8-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Wallace Avenue between East 98th Terrace and East 97th Terrace;
- Replace 730 LF of 6-inch CIP and 210 LF of 2-inch CIP with 6-inch and 8-inch DIP along Booth Avenue north of East 99th Street towards the dead end;
- Replace 840 LF of 8-inch CIP with 8-inch DIP along East 98th Terrace between Marsh Avenue and Booth Avenue;

- Replace 1,130 LF of 10-inch CIP with 8-inch DIP along Marsh Avenue between James A. Reed Road and East 99th Street;
- Replace 1,110 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Richmond Avenue between East Bannister Road and Fairwood Drive;
- Replace 1,380 LF of 4-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Elm Avenue between East 87th Street and East 90th Terrace;
- Replace 6,140 LF of 24-inch CIP water main with 24-inch DIP along Old Santa Fe Road between East Bannister Road and East 87th Street;
- Replace 4,060 LF of 6-inch and 10-inch CIP water mains with 12-inch DIP along Blue Parkway between Raytown City limits and Blue Parkway; and
- Replace 2,670 LF of 16-inch CIP with 16-inch DIP along Lee's Summit Road between Gregory Boulevard and Woods Chapel Road.

This contract also includes project administration, preliminary field and record investigations, property surveys, pipeline route survey, preliminary and final design, and preparation of construction drawings for bidding.

The original \$645,320.00 contract was executed by the City on December 1, 2021 after City Council approved Ordinance No. 210866. This proposed \$146,300.00 Amendment No. 1 will add 120 to the contract's term and will have additional design work for approximately 4,600 linear feed of a 12-inch DIP water main to replace an existing 12-inch CIP water main east of Noland Road along Highway 350 (Blue Parkway).

Executive Summary

Estimating revenue in the amount of \$300,000.00 in the Capital Improvements Fund; appropriating this amount to the Milrey Stoddard Flood Control account; authorizing a Cooperative Agreement with Platte County, Missouri for the Design and Development, and Management of the Milrey-Stoddard Storm Water Improvements; and authorizing a \$487,373.00 contract with Wilson and Company, Inc., for the design of the Milrey Stoddard Flood Control project.

Discussion

Project Justification

Walnut Creek, a tributary of Rush Creek which generally parallels Stoddard Ave between NW 73rd Street and NW 83rd Street, has been impacted by increased runoff and surrounding development patterns.

The City completed an initial phase of the project in the mid-2000's but did not complete the entire flood control mitigation due to a lack of funding.

Neighbors along this section of creek complain of stream bank erosion, property flooding, roadway flooding, and damage to utilities.

Walnut Creek flows into unincorporated Platte County and the City and County seek to address watershed issues via an agreed upon project that provides flood relief in the upper reaches of Walnut Creek.

With the approval for Committee Substitute for Resolution 220937, the 2024-2028 Citywide Business Plan was approved which included the Submitted FY 2024-2025 GOKC Bond Five Year Plan which included funding in FY 2025-2026 to complete the remaining flood control mitigation for the Milray-Stoddard area of Walnut Creek.

Multiple studies have been completed to look at possible solutions to the problems along this section of creek with the most recent being the NW Stoddard Detention Preliminary Engineering Study completed by Wilson and Company, Inc. for the City dated June 13, 2019 and the County wishes to help accelerate the design of the project to allow for construction in 2025.

Project Description

The cooperative agreement will provide for a cooperative effort between the City of Kansas City, Missouri (City) and Platte County, Missouri (County) whereby County will provide Parks and Stormwater sales tax funds, in an amount not to exceed \$300,000.00, for the purpose of preparing construction design documents for mitigating flooding impacts along Walnut Creek.

Work on the design professional services project with Wilson & Company, Inc. will include development of construction documents, special provisions, and cost estimates to construct a regional detention pond along Walnut Creek, south of NW 83rd Street and north of NW 80th Street; expand culverts under NW 77th Terrace, Belvidere Parkway, NW 75th Terrace and NW 75th Street; regrade and stabilize Walnut Creek between Belvidere Parkway and Park Forest downstream of NW 75th Street.

Work on this design professional services project should be completed within 270 days following the City's issuance of the Notice to Proceed.

Solicitation/Selection

A solicitation waiver was approved by the City Manager on November 3, 2023.

Persuant to Code of Ordinance Section 3-7(a)(3), a Specialized Waiver for Design Professional Contracts can be requested to utilize the same design professional for additional design work on subsequent phases of the same project, without a new qualification based selection process.

This waiver is requested for Wilson & Company, Inc. to provide design work on the subsequent design phase of the Milrey Stoddard Flood Control project. Wilson & Company, Inc. was the original design professional on the NW Stoddard Detention – Preliminary Engineering Study in 2018.

It is in the best interest of the city to contract with Wilson & Company, Inc. to retain the historical knowledge and understanding of the project area gained from the study, therefore eliminating the time and expense needed for a new design professional to become acclimated.

- (a) Pursuant to Section 38-104, City Code Ordinances, Contractor shall not base a hiring or promotional decision on an applicant's criminal history or sentence related thereto, unless the employer can demonstrate that the employment-related decision was based on all information available including consideration of the frequency, recentness and severity of a criminal record and that the record was reasonably related to the duties and responsibilities of the position.
- (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), Contractor may inquire about an applicant's criminal history after it has been determined that the individual is otherwise qualified for the position, and only after the applicant has been interviewed for the position. Any such inquiry may be made of all applicants who are within the final selection pool of candidates from which a job will be filled.
- (c) This provision shall not apply to positions where employers are required to exclude applicants with certain criminal convictions from employment due to local, state or federal law or regulation.

<u>Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.</u> Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 requires that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national or origin (including limited English proficient individuals), be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance. The City of Kansas City, Missouri requires compliance with the requirements of Title VI in all of its programs and activities regardless of the funding source.

Contractor shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, or national or origin (including limited English proficient individuals).

<u>Quality Services Assurance Act.</u> If this Contract exceeds \$160,000.00, Contractor certifies Contractor will pay all employees who will work on this Contract in the city limits of Kansas City, Missouri at least \$15.00 per hour in compliance with the City's Quality Services Assurance Act,



Section 3-66, Code of Ordinances or City has granted Contractor an exemption pursuant to the Quality Services Assurance Act.

<u>Anti-Discrimination Against Israel.</u> If this Contract exceeds \$100,000.00 and Contractor employs at least ten employees, pursuant to Section 34.600, RSMo., by executing this Contract, Contractor certifies it is not currently engaged in and shall not, for the duration of this contract, engage in a boycott of goods or services from the State of Israel; companies doing business in or with Israel or authorized by, licensed by, or organized under the laws of the State of Israel; or persons or entities doing business in the State of Israel.

Affirmative Action. If this Contract exceeds \$300,000.00 and Contractor employs fifty (50) or more people, Contractor shall comply with City's Affirmative Action requirements in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3 of City's Code, the rules and regulations relating to those sections, and any additions or amendments thereto; in executing any Contract subject to said provisions, Contractor warrants that it has an affirmative action program in place and will maintain the affirmative action program in place for the duration of the Contract. Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, sex, religion, national origin or ancestry, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or age in a manner prohibited by Chapter 3 of City's Code. Contractor shall:

- (a) Execute and submit the City of Kansas City, Missouri CREO Affirmative Action Program Affidavit warranting that the Contractor has an affirmative action program in place and will maintain the affirmative action program in place for the duration of the Contract.
- (b) Submit, in print or electronic format, a copy of Contractor's current certificate of compliance to the City's Civil Rights and Equal Opportunity Department (CREO) prior to receiving the first payment under the Contract, unless a copy has already been submitted to CREO at any point within the previous two (2) calendar years. If, and only if, Contractor does not possess a current certification of compliance, Contractor shall submit, in print or electronic format, a copy of its affirmative action program to CREO prior to receiving the first payment under the Contract, unless a copy has already been submitted to CREO at any point within the previous two (2) calendar years.
- (c) Require any Subcontractor awarded a subcontract exceeding \$300,000.00 to affirm that Subcontractor has an affirmative action program in place and will maintain the affirmative action program in place for the duration of the subcontract.
- (d) Obtain from any Subcontractor awarded a subcontract exceeding \$300,000.00 a copy of the Subcontractor's current certificate of compliance and tender a copy of the same, in print or



electronic format, to CREO within thirty (30) days from the date the subcontract is executed. If, and only if, Subcontractor does not possess a current certificate of compliance, Contractor shall obtain a copy of the Subcontractor's affirmative action program and tender a copy of the same, in print or electronic format, to CREO within thirty (30) days from the date the subcontract is executed.

City has the right to take action as directed by City's Civil Rights and Equal Opportunity Department to enforce this provision. If Contractor fails, refuses or neglects to comply with the provisions of Chapter 3 of City's Code, then such failure shall be deemed a total breach of this Contract and this Contract may be terminated, cancelled or suspended, in whole or in part, and Contractor may be declared ineligible for any further contracts funded by City for a period of one (1) year. This is a material term of this Contract.

Compliance with Laws. Contractor shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations applicable to the work and this Agreement. Contractor shall maintain in effect all the licenses, permissions, authorizations, consents and permits that it needs to carry out its obligations under this Agreement.

Prevailing Wage. If the Agreement exceeds \$75,000.00 and any of the Services performed by Contractor includes construction, reconstruction, improvement, enlargement, alteration, painting and decorating, or major repair, that is subject to the Missouri Prevailing Wage Law (Section 290.210, RSMo - 290.340, RSMo), Contractor shall immediately notify the City prior to performing Services so the parties can execute an agreement that incorporates, the appropriate Wage Order. Contractor shall comply with all requirements of Section 290.210, RSMo – 290.340, RSMo even if Contractor fails to notify the City.

It is recommended that in accordance with Code Sec. 3-7(a)(3), the solicitation requirements of Code Sec. 3-3 be waived and that approval be granted to enter into a contract with <u>Wilson & Company</u> to provide <u>Design Professional</u> services. The estimated contract amount is <u>\$487,373.00</u>. The factors supporting this recommendation are as follows:

Per Code Section 3-7(a)(3) a Specialized Waiver for Design Professional Contracts can be requested to utilize the same design professional for additional design work on subsequent phases of the same project, without a new qualification based selection process. This waiver is requested for Wilson & Company to provide design work on the subsequent design phase of the Milray Stoddard Flood Control project. Wilson & Company was the original design professional on the NW Stoddard Detention – Preliminary Engineering Study in 2018.

It is in the best interest of the city to contract with Wilson & Company to retain the historical knowledge and understanding of the project area gained from the study, therefore eliminating the time and expense needed for a new design professional to become acclimated.
