Executive Summary

The legislation will allow the Chief Procurement Officer to enter into a three (3) year agreement with the option to renew for for one (1) additional three (3) year period following the initial term with Ticketmaster, LLC, to provide ticketing services to the clients of the Kansas City Convention and Entertainment Facilities Department

Discussion

Ticketmaster has provided ticketing services for over forty (40) years and has been ticketing agent for the following organizations and facilities in our region including: Department of Convention and Entertainment Facilities, T-Mobile Center, Kaufman Stadium, GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium, The Midland, Cable Dahmer Arena, Kansas Speedway, Children Mercy Park, Union Station, Uptown Theater and Azura Amphitheater.

Ticketmaster will offer tickets for sale via internet, telephone, mobile device, VIP Packages, presales and other means of distribution. Patrons purchasing tickets through Ticketmaster will be charged a service fee.

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The Procurement Division of the General Services Department issued a Request for Proposal with Ticketmaster being the sole responder.
