Brief Title

Amendment to Chapter 20.

Details

Reason for Legislation

To amend Chapter 20 of the Code of Ordinances by transferring the responsibility for issuing tobacco licenses and permits from the Revenue Division of the Finance Department to the Regulated Industries Division of Neighborhoods and Housing Services.

To amend Chapter 20 and Chapter 50 of the Code of Ordinances to include alternative nicotine products and vapor products in the posting of notice against sales to minors required in retail outlets selling such products.

To amend Chapter 50 of the Code of Ordinances to make it unlawful to sell alternative nicotine products or vapor products to minors, or for minors to possess such products.

Discussion

Regulated Industries Division currently issues licenses and individual permits on a regular basis, as the division is equipped to process a high number of license and permits. In the calendar year of 2014, Regulated Industries Division issued more than 12,000 permits and certificates to individuals. The division also processes applications for the renewal of over 3,000 licenses and permits spread throughout the year on an annual basis.

Regulated Industries Division oversees all liquor licensed businesses, commercial amusement places (skating rinks, haunted houses, adult entertainment businesses, dance halls, bowling alleys, skating rinks), day labor businesses, short term loan establishments, vehicles for hire (taxicabs, livery vehicles, sightseeing vehicles, transportation network vehicles and pedicabs) secondary metal recyclers and tire dealers.

Regulated Industries investigators conduct a variety of inspections and investigations, which include minor compliance checks for the sale of tobacco and alcohol, synthetic drug investigations, inspections of taxicab and livery vehicles at KCI and the arenas, stadiums, and entertainment and shopping districts throughout the city, adult entertainment and adult book store businesses, secondary metal recycling businesses, short term loan establishments and tire dealer businesses to assure for public safety and compliance with the City Ordinances.

Regulated Industries Division has conducted more than 200 minor tobacco compliance inspections through FY 2014-15. Since the division already makes compliance checks and enforces regulations under Chapter 20 of the tobacco ordinance, it makes sense to have the Manager of Regulated Industries Division oversee the entire chapter, and to have the ability to issue licenses and stamps and take enforcement action against a licensee or employee when needed.
