Reason for Legislation

This is an agreement entered into by and between the State of Missouri, Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS) and the Kansas City Health Department for the purpose of conducting food safety inspections and enforcing expeditious correction of critical errors in food preparation and service at Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) meal production and meal service sites.

Discussion

The Environmental Public Health Program (EPHP) will perform sanitation and food safety inspection at 85 selected sites to be limited to the inspection of the kitchen, food preparation and holding areas, and delivery units associated with each site. Also to conduct follow-up inspection to verify correction of critical violations that were not corrected during the initial inspection. Each initial inspection report received and approved by the State Department of Health will be reimbursed at a fixed rate of \$100.00. Each approved additional inspection will be reimbursed at a fixed rate of \$60.00. Inspections attempted for facilities or service sites, that are either no longer operating or changed their hours of operation will be reimbursed at a fixed rate of \$30.00. All inspection and follow-up inspection will be performed on the DHSS inspection reports and addendums.

Is it good for the children?

Many of the Health Department's programs are specifically designed for the betterment of health in all citizens. The participation in the Summer Food Program Service Inspections will ensure that food served to the children and families that are participating in the Program is prepared, transported and served according to the KCMO Food Code.

How will this contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?

This participation will move the Program forward and will serve as a model for surrounding state and local food programs. Assuring safe and healthful food establishments and service sites will contribute to quality improvement of the Kansas City Missouri residence and environment.
