This EPA brownfields grant is awarded to the City on behalf of a coalition including Jackson County and the Land Clearance for Redevelopment Authority of Kansas City, Missouri (LCRA). Grant funds are for the assessment of hazardous substances and petroleum brownfield sites in Kansas City and Jackson County, Missouri

This grant application was authorized by Resolution 141002, adopted December 11, 2014.

No local match is required. No additional appropriation of City funds is necessary to receive these grants.
