#### **Discussion**

THE MWDBE CREO CUP WAS APPROVED FOR 10% MBE AND 10% WBE PARTICIPATION.

The Missouri River Levee System and associated control facilities consisting of a complex system of water meters, relief wells and a collector system protect the airport from flooding and must be maintained on a regular basis.

The intent of the project is to replace four (4) relief wells (RW) (32A, 33A, 34A and 36A) and pump test an additional seven (7) RW (2A, 5A, 11A, 14A, 22A, 27A and 31A) at the Kansas City Wheeler Downtown Airport (MKC).

#### **Discussion**

The Front Street Improvements project has recently restarted the land acquisition for completion of the first phase of the improvements from Chouteau Parkway to the Rail Crossing between N Southern Road and N Topping Avenue. Improvements in this corridor have been in planning or design since 2010. Phasing of these improvements is necessary to maximize the funding that is available. The additional scope in this amendment will allow the consultant to complete that plans based on the new phasing, update the required federal funding documentation and prepare the final plans for bid in the next calendar year.

CREO recently modified the goals to a planned total of 12% MBE/13% WBE and will be carried forward with this amendment by utilizing Schmitz, King & Associates, TREKK Design Group, and Patti Banks Associates, LLC dba Vireo.

Authorizing a \$1,100,000.00 Design Professional Services contract with CDM Smith, Inc., for the Stormwater Collection and Green Infrastructure: 37th and Norton project; authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$2,200,000.00; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

#### **Discussion**

#### Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 14 of a 30-year implementation period. Through the use of an adaptive management process defined in the Consent Decree, the EPA approved this project for implementation in lieu of a less effective project to reduce combined sewer overflows and protect public health and the environment.

#### **Contract Description**

The scope of work to be provided under the design contract includes sewer separation of approximately 195 acres and green infrastructure with approximately 2 to 4 million gallons of stormwater storage to provide treatment of separated stormwater. The design will include developing and evaluating alternatives for sewer separation, stormwater source control, and green infrastructure and will require collaboration with various stakeholders. The recommended design alternative will provide increased system-wide combined sewer overflow capture, reduce peak flows to the Blue River Interceptor Sewer (BRIS) and reduce downstream BRIS overflows. The initial contract in the amount of \$1,100,000.00 is to complete the alternatives evaluation and preliminary design of the selected alternative.

The term of the initial contract will be 300 calendar days.


