The new buildings will be three stories, matching the existing structure, and will feature stucco and metal panels with reinforced concrete walls.

Access will be via vacated W. 49th Street, which serves this parcel and the 433 Ward Parkway Condominiums. A permanent turnaround at W. 49th Street's terminus will meet KCFD specifications. The site slopes significantly from south to north, requiring stabilization with retaining walls and ground cover. A copy of this presentation is on file with the City Clerk's office.

Approving the Substantial Amendment to 2018-2021 One Year Action Plans to reprogram funding for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); approving the Substantial Amendment to the 2021 Action Plan for CDBG CARES Act funding; appropriating CDBG funding in the years of 2018-2021 in the amount of \$5,181,166.00 and funding in the amount of \$650,000.00 for CDBG CARES Act funding; authorizing the Director of Housing and Community Development Department to expend \$5,831,166.00; authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute contracts; and amending the CDBG appropriation amounts of \$3,938,245.47 and the revenue estimate amounts of \$5,907,415.12, previously appropriated funding from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for CDBG projects.

Dion Lewis, Housing and Community Development Department, presented. This ordinance approves substantial amendments to the 2018-2021 One Year Action Plans and the 2021 Action Plan for CDBG CARES Act funding. It reprograms \$5,181,166.00 for CDBG projects and \$650,000.00 for CDBG CARES Act projects. The Director of Housing and Community Development is authorized to expend these funds, and the Manager of Procurement Services can execute contracts. The ordinance also amends the CDBG appropriation and revenue estimates to align with HUD funding. The funds will support public facilities, neighborhood revitalization, homeless prevention, and workforce development.
