Executive Summary

Resolution expressing support to apply for various MARC federal programmatic funds that will construct or rebuild transportation improvements within the City of Kansas City.

Discussion

Public Works has identified priority transportation projects. These projects are eligible for the programmatic federal transportation funds managed through MARC, including Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ), Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG), Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), and Carbon Reduction (CR) programs. These grants fund projects at 80% federal and requires a 20% local match.
