Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$3,537,460.00 Construction contract with Kissick construction Company, Inc., for the Relief Sewer: Hardesty Ave and 31st St project; authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$3,900,000.00; authorizing a \$645,000.00 design professional services Amendment No. 1 to Contract 1506 with Lamp Rynearson, Inc. for Relief Sewer: Hardesty Ave and 31st St Project for a total contract amount of \$1,185,000.00; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 13 of a 25-year implementation period. The purpose of this project is to provide additional conveyance capacity from combined sewage to the Blue River Interceptor Sewer that will reduce combined sewer overflows at Outfall 039 in the Lower Blue River Basin.

Construction Contract Description

The scope of work to be provided under the construction contract includes 2,977 linear feet (LF) of new sanitary sewer ranging in diameter from 30-inches to 48-inches near Stadium Drive and US Hwy 40. The amount of the proposed construction contract is \$3,537,460.00 plus a contingency amount of \$362,540.00 for a total of \$3,900,000.00.

The term of this project will be 370 calendar days.

Solicitation

The Relief Sewer: Hardesty Ave and 31st Street was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements on August 25, 2023, and bids were opened on September 19, 2023, with five (5) bidders responding.

Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

Kissick Construction Company, Inc. submitted the lowest, responsible, and responsive bid of \$3,537,460.00, with subcontracting participation of 10% MBE and 10% WBE.

Other Bidders/Subcontracting Participation

Infrastructure Solutions, LLC was the next lowest bidder on this project. They submitted a bid in the amount of \$4,708,000.00, with subcontracting participation of 10% MBE and 10% WBE.

Estimated Opinion of Probable Construction Costs

The Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost was \$8,312,000.00.

Design Professional Services Contract Amendment Description

Proposed Amendment No. 1 to Design Professional Services Contract Number 1506 in the amount of \$645,000.00, for a total contract amount of \$1,185,000.00 will provide for construction phase services including project management and administration services, construction office and field support services, and resident project representative services.

City Council passed Ordinance No. 190672 on August 29, 2019, authorizing a \$540,000 design professional services Contract Number 1506 with Lamp Rynearson, Inc. for conceptual, preliminary, and final design of the Relief Sewer: Hardesty and 31st Street project.

This project will provide additional conveyance capacity from combined sewage to the Blue River Interceptor Sewer that will reduce combined sewer overflows at Outfall 039 in the Lower Blue River Basin.
