Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$2,350,000.00 design professional services contract with Carollo Engineers, Inc., for the High Rate Treatment: Blue River Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Project; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Reason for Contract

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. The City's Smart Sewer Program is currently in year 15 of a 30-year implementation period. The purpose of this project is to reduce combined sewer overflows into the Blue River by constructing a high-rate treatment facility at the Blue River Wastewater Treatment Plant primary treatment site to be operated during wet-weather events.

Design Contract Description

The scope of work to be provided under the design contract includes conceptual design of the high-rate treatment facility, regulatory assistance with permitting and approval of the treatment system addition, and assistance to the City during procurement of a design-build construction contract and application for a State Revolving Fund loan. This design professional services contract is a continuation of the Blue River Wastewater Treatment Plant Facility Plan and Improvements Design Contract No. 1677 that included provisions for three contract years (base year plus two follow-on years).

Term

The term of the design professional services project will be 365 calendar days.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 11% MBE and 11% WBE on the design professional services Contract No. 1779 on August 25, 2025.

Solicitation

The Request for Proposals/Qualifications for the Blue River WWTP Facility Plan and Improvements Design project (Contract No. 1677) were advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Two proposals were received on January 27, 2023.

Consultant Selection/Subcontracting Participation

Carollo Engineers, Inc. was selected for this project in accordance with Code of Ordinance Section 3-31(b)(1), Citywide selection, with subcontracting participation of 14% MBE and 14% WBE.

A Citywide selection committee met on March 22, 2023, and consisted of the following individuals:

City Council passed Ordinance No. 230560 on July 13, 2023, authorizing a \$3,430,000.00 design professional services Contract No. 1677 with Carollo Engineers, Inc., for the Blue River Wastewater Treatment Plant Facility Plan and Improvements Design project.

Ordinance No. 240804 was subsequently passed on September 19, 2024, authorizing a \$3,999,932.00 Amendment No. 1 to Contract No. 1677.

This high-rate treatment facility will increase the hydraulic capacity at the Blue River WWTP to treat wet-weather flows and will reduce combined sewer overflow volume being discharged to the Blue River thereby protecting public health and the environment.

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri would be able to supply the water demand of 3.6 million gallons per day (MGD) in the future with the understanding that pipeline infrastructure may need to be upgraded to accommodate this request at the City of Kearney's expense; and

WHEREAS, Kansas City, Missouri is willing to deliver and sell water to the City of Kearney, Missouri in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That the Director of Water Services is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of Kansas City, a renewal for a Cooperative Agreement for Water Purchase between the City of Kearney, Missouri and Kansas City, Missouri, for a period of twenty-five (25) years. Executive Summary

Authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute a \$6,000,000.00 construction contract with Ace Pipe Cleaning, Inc., for the Large Diameter Sewer Rehabilitation project; authorizing four successive renewal options with further City Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification

This contract will assist the Water Services Department's Sewer Line Maintenance Division in the rehabilitation of public storm and sanitary sewers (48 inches and larger), and associated manholes located within the public right-of-way or easements throughout Kansas City, Missouri.

The repairs will restore structural integrity and operability to deteriorated storm and sanitary sewers, will provide customers with reliable wastewater services, and will improve customer satisfaction by providing timely response to 311 service requests.

Project Description

The scope of services consists of rehabilitation, repair, and replacement of large diameter storm and sanitary sewer mains and structures in the wastewater collection system and all other miscellaneous supporting work as directed by the Water Services Department. Rehabilitation and repair will be through the application of specialized liners with new structures added as-needed.
