## **Executive Summary**

Authorizing execution of a contract with the Economic Development Corporation of Kansas City, Missouri in an amount not to exceed \$5,196,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds for certain development and redevelopment activities; authorizing expenditure from previously appropriated funds; and designating requisitioning authority.

#### **Discussion**

This ordinance authorizes the contract with the Economic Development Corporation of Kansas City, Missouri from funds previously appropriated by the Fiscal Year 2025-26 Adopted Budget. The City of Kansas City allocates funding to support the EDC on an annual basis. The contract will allow EDC to provide services that focus on economic development and redevelopment, business retention and attraction, and entrepreneurship. The contract also allows EDC to provide support to a variety of agencies that operate under its umbrella.
