Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$500,000.00 construction contract with SHEDIGS IT, LLC, for the Valve Straightening and Water Distribution System Repairs, Renewal No. 2 project; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this construction project to provide maintenance support for the Water Services Department's Pipeline Division for repair and replacement of water distribution main valves in the distribution system throughout Kansas City, Missouri.

Project Description

This contract consists of straightening misaligned valve boxes as well as performing other water distribution system repairs on an as-needed basis. This contract is based on unit prices and will total \$1,500,000.00 maximum over three fiscal years for the cumulative of the original contract, Renewal No. 1 and this ordinance's Renewal No. 2. Work will be performed throughout Kansas City, in Cass, Clay, Jackson, and Platte Counties, Missouri.

The original contract was based on unit prices with a maximum obligation of \$500,000.00 for one fiscal year with two potential \$500,000.00 renewals at the City's option (a total of \$1,500,000.00 maximum commitment over three fiscal years). This ordinance is for the second and final renewal option, which cumulatively exceeds the \$1,000,000.00 ordinance threshold for construction contracts.

Executed Contract Summary

The City executed a \$500,000.00 construction contract under Contract No. 9746 on August 17, 2022, which also authorized two successive renewals.

The City executed a \$500,000.00 construction contract with SHEDIGS IT, LLC under Contract No. 9746-1 on July 20, 2023 for Renewal No. 1. The City executed a no-cost Change Order No. 1 on April 4, 2024 extending the term an additional 90 days to utilize remaining funds in the contract for Renewal No. 1.

The City executed a no-cost Change Order No. 2 on September 27, 2024 changing the responsibility of obtaining excavation and degradation permits to the contractor.

This proposed \$500,000.00 ordinance under Contract No. 9746-2 is for the second and final renewal option. With this renewal, the cumulative costs exceeds the \$1,000,000.00 ordinance threshold for construction contracts.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this professional, specialized or technical services project because a service line materials inventory is needed to be in compliance with the Environmental Protection Agency and Missouri Department of Natural Resources Safe Drinking Water Act revised Lead and Copper rule requirements for a completed documented inventory of service line materials for both public and private components and a method for the public to look up the information related to their service line.

<u>Design Professional Services Project Description/Executed Contract Summary</u>

This project will develop an inventory of known and/or suspected locations of leaded lines and leaded service materials by reviewing all service line installation and construction records. This will result in a data inventory using Department data analytics and software to provide, among other deliverables, a public facing interface to provide data for ratepayers and users of the City's water supply and distribution system.

City Council passed Ordinance No. 230204 on March 16, 2023 authorizing a \$1,779,000.00 professional, specialized or technical services contract with AECOM Technical Services, Inc., for the Drinking Water Service Line Materials Inventory project. The City executed the contract on April 28, 2023.

Dollars paid to prime contractor to date: \$4,142,391.29

Dollars paid to MBEs by prime contractor to date: \$221,624.56 for 5.4%% MBE Dollars paid to WBEs by prime contractor to date: \$120,695.72 for 3% WBE.

The prime contractor has not received payments for July and August 2024 due to issues with payrolls. According to the prime contractor, another reason for the current shortfall is as follows:

"The work that has been completed to date has been mostly associated with demolition and concrete formwork, which does not have much MWBE participation with it. The majority of MWBE participation will occur after the new structure is complete and the MEP and Finish scopes of work begin during the interior renovation of the garage."

The prime contractor has provided a projection demonstrating that they do expect to meet the participation listed on the approved CUP.

*Note: Alexander Mechanical's subcontract amount is currently listed as \$2,237,625.69, but they are subcontracting \$251,368.84 of that work to other subcontractors- only one (1) of which is certified (Parrish & Sons Construction). Alexander Mechanical's amount for credit to the MBE goal is \$1,986,256.85.

**Note: Parrish & Sons has a second subcontract under Alexander Mechanical.

WHEREAS, the City Council recognized Vision Zero as the endorsed approach toward reaching this goal through Resolution No. 200019 in May 2020; and

WHEREAS, part of Vision Zero road diets are an effective traffic calming implementation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council directed staff to conduct a citywide road diet analysis through Resolution No. 230618 in August 2023; and

WHEREAS, staff has identified a listing of potential streets which would make good candidates for a road diet; and

WHEREAS, the potential streets have been vetted by staff using criteria including but not limited to the scheduled resurfacing program, streets which are four or more lanes undivided, corridors identified as part of High-injury network; traffic volumes; existing studies and developable areas; and

WHEREAS, the next step in the process will be to begin community engagement for candidate streets and road diet streets whenever they overlap with the resurfacing program; and

WHEREAS, staff plans to review potential streets for road dieting every five years and present an updated plan to Council, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That a road diet implementation plan and process by the Public Works Department is adopted.

Non-discrimination in Employment. - (b) Submit, in print or electronic format, a copy of Contractor's current certificate of compliance to the City's Civil Rights and Equal Opportunity Department (CREO) prior to receiving the first payment under the Contract, unless a copy has already been submitted to CREO at any point within the previous two (2) calendar years. If, and only if, Contractor does not possess a current certification of compliance, Contractor shall submit, in print or electronic format, a copy of its affirmative action program to CREO prior to receiving the first payment under the Contract, unless a copy has already been submitted to CREO at any point within the previous two (2) calendar years.
