Discussion HIV surveillance is responsible for identifying and coordinating the reporting of HIV disease in a 5 County region of Missouri. Routine contact with physicians, hospitals and laboratories facilitate this reporting and the aggregate numbers are then returned to the community as data reports which support numerous grant applications and prevention activities. HIV Surveillance provides the data and statistical information needed to apply and maintain funds that support Ryan White activities that assist those living with HIV in the Kansas City metropolitan area.  In 2019, the Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America was introduced and would leverage the data and tools now available to reduce new HIV infections in the United States by 75 percent in five years and by 90 percent by 2030. The tenets of the proposed plan build upon two simple ideas—we have the right data and the right tools to dramatically impact the US HIV epidemics.
