Executive Summary

Amending Chapter 48, Code of Ordinances, by repealing Section 48-51, Chronic nuisance, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter.

Discussion

This ordinance amends Chapter 48, Code of Ordinances, by repealing Section 48-51, Chronic nuisance, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter to:

- Establishing a separate criterion for violent offenses with a lower threshold such that a single violent-offense combined with one other qualifying incident within six months triggers Neighborhood's review under the ordinance;
- Reducing the number of incidents required to qualify as a standard case within a 180-day period from seven incidents to five (the three incidents in 30 days timeframe remains unchanged); and
- Shortening the abatement timeline for violent-offense cases to ten days (the standard 30-day timeline will remain for non-violent cases, such as three incidents in 30 days or the proposed five in 180 days)
- Additionally, the amendment would broaden the reports that trigger Neighborhood's evaluation of chronic nuisances. Once passed, the revised language will allow Neighborhoods to rely on reports from KCPD, licensed private security officers, and the Multidisciplinary Public Safety Task Force. No
