Goals for Multi-Modal Transportation Commission

- Coordinate comprehensive multi-modal transportation planning, policy development, and parking management
- Create one body instead of two overlapping commissions
- Align with Boards and Commissions standing rules in Ordinance 220943

Key Changes – Membership

- Removes naming of specific organizations in the membership. Lists expertise in:
 - public **transit planning and operations**;
 - **bicycle** and **pedestrian** infrastructure;
 - transit **accessibility** and **Americans with Disabilities Act** compliance;
 - **Six members** representing different Kansas City districts to ensure geographic diversity and broad community representation, while ensuring representation from the **ridership community**.

Key Changes – Membership

- Adds explicit language that Mayor will solicit recommendations from City Council members to ensure representations across City Council districts
- Quorum is five members

Key Changes – Duties and powers

- Expanded duties scope to include review of existing transportation, corridor, and streetscape & recommending funding applications
- Grants authority to create working groups and/or subcommittees as needed
- Moved parking adjudication process language from other section

Key Changes – Specialized Focus Meetings

- Simplified notification requirements by encouraging rather than mandating outreach to all impacted neighborhood areas
- Lists specialized meetings to be held at least once per year as part of the regular monthly schedule
 - Public transit coordination and operations
 - Bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure
 - Parking policy and management
 - Regional coordination and planning
- States all meetings shall consider accessibility and community engagement throughout agenda topics
