Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$1,650,000.00 construction contract with Leath & Sons, Inc., for the Water Department Emergency Transmission Water Main Repair Renewal No. 1 project; authorizing three successive renewal options for a maximum of \$6,765,000.00 with further City Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification

KC Water is undertaking this project to make scheduled and emergency repairs to the transmission water mains throughout the City's water distribution system.

<u>Project Description/Contract Summary</u>

The scope of work to be provided under this contract will include scheduled and emergency transmission water main repairs to the City's water distribution system.

This ordinance also authorizes the Director of Water Services to execute Renewal N0. 1 and three successive one-year renewal options for this contract with additional City Council approval.

City Council approved Ordinance No. 240485 on June 13, 2024, which authorized a \$1,650,000.00 construction contract with Leath & Sons, Inc., for the Water Department

Emergency Transmission Water Main Repair project. The ordinance also authorized four successive renewal options with further City Council approval.

The City executed three change orders on this contract totaling \$165,000.00.

This proposed ordinance is for the first of four renewal options for this contract in the amount of \$1,650,000.00.

The term of this contract is 365 calendar days.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 11% MBE and 11% WBE for this construction project on February 14, 2024 as part of the CREO KC Annual Goal Program.

Solicitation

This project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Public bids were opened on April 2, 2024 with 7 bidders responding.

<u>Awardee/Subcontracting Participation</u>

Leath & Sons, Inc. was selected for this project as the lowest, most responsive, and most responsible bidder with a bid amount of \$864,579.00, with subcontracting participation of 11% MBE and 11% WBE.

Unit prices for the work to be completed under this contract were set based on the bids received. Therefore, KC Water proposed a not to exceed \$1,650,000.00 contract to complete restoration work orders.
