Ordinance 240999 Missouri Fire Fighter Critical Illness Trust & Pool

Purpose of the Pool

- Coverage for cancer diagnosis and treatment for fire fighters
- Pool formation will use existing MO enabling statute section 537.620 within the Uniform Individual Accident and Sickness Insurance Law to form the Pool.
- Cash awards are paid within 10 days of a completed application to include the attending physician's diagnosis.
- Up to \$4,000 disbursements are made semi-monthly based on schedule of benefits.
- Payments are made before sick leave and vacation time need to be used.
- Diagnosis for the purposes of this program with the employers' agreement will be treated as an at-work occurrence for the purpose of paying applicable benefits but not prompting a Workers' Compensation claim
- This program coverage is technically not disability insurance; it is accident coverage.
- This benefit does not exclude the filing of a Workers' Compensation claim; however, any payments made under this program will be offset under Workers' Compensation.



Who is Eligible

- 1. The firefighter's employer must elect to join the Pool and pay their annual contribution.
- 2. Firefighter must have been active for five years with a minimum of 24 hours of training.
- 3. Firefighter must have been exposed to hazardous duty as defined in MO statute
- 4. Firefighter must be listed on the roster and a contribution paid



What is Covered

- Seventeen specific cancers are covered including: bladder, brain, breast, colon, esophagus, kidney, lung, melanoma, mesothelioma, multiple myeloma, NHL, prostate, rectal, skin, stomach, testicular, and thyroid.
- Other cancers or diseases which adversely affect firefighters can be added by the Board as new studies or findings are published.
- Smoking, or the use of tobacco products reduces benefits by 25%. The consideration of Breast Cancer and Heart Disease, which have already been implemented in Colorado can be considered.



Fiscal Impact

- \$100,000 of coverage for eligible fire fighters = \$44/per person
 - \$67,392 full contribution annually
- Currently contributions are being subsidized until 2027
- Actual annual cost with subsidy= \$47,520
- After 2027 anticipate 3% cost of coverage increase annually
