Executive Summary

Amending Chapter 50, Code of Ordinances, by repealing Section 50-161, Loitering, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter titled, Obstructing reasonable movement of traffic.

Discussion

This ordinance amends Chapter 50, Code of Ordinances, by repealing Section 50-161, Loitering, by making it unlawful for any person to: stand or otherwise position themselves in any public place in such manner so as to obstruct, impede, interfere with, hinder or delay the reasonable movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic; or the reasonably free use of property or business lawfully conducted by anyone in or upon or facing or fronting on any such public place or building.
