Authorizing a \$1,814,298.16 construction contract with Leath & Sons, Inc., for the Water Main Replacement in the Area of E. 50th Terrace to Swope Parkway, E. 55th Street to The Paseo Boulevard project; and authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$1,995,727.98.

Jeff Martin and David Poirier, Water Department, presented. This ordinance authorizes a construction contract with Leath & Sons, Inc., in the amount of \$1,814,298.16 for the water main replacement around E. 50th Terrace to Swope Parkway, E. 55th Street to The Paseo Boulevard project. The maximum authorized expenditure for this contract is \$1,995,727.98. The purpose of this construction project is to improve distribution system reliability, increase hydraulic conveyance capacity, and support fire protection to replace aging, break-prone cast iron pipe water mains with ductile iron pipe. Authorizing a \$564,728.00 design professional services contract Amendment No. 5 to Contract No. 9472 with Black & Veatch Corporation, for the Modernization Improvements at the Water Treatment Plant project; authorizing an extension of the term for an additional 731 days for a total term of 2,839 days (approximately 7 years 9 months) for a total contract amount of \$10,687,440.00; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

This ordinance authorizes a \$564,728.00 design professional services contract amendment no. 5 with Black & Veatch Corporation to contract no. 9472. This contract is for the modernization improvements for the Water Treatment Plant project. An extension to the terms is for an additional 731 days for a total of 2,839 days for a total contract amount of \$10,687,440.00. The project will consist of addressing rehabilitation needs, optimizing the treatment process, increasing the treatment capacity from 240 to 270 million gallons per day, and eliminating restrictions to increase the hydraulic capacity to 300 million gallons per day. Authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute contracts (Contract No. EV3765) with Mid-America Regional Council (\$300,000.00), Bridging the Gap, Inc. (\$1,766,060.00), Deep Roots KC, Inc. (\$250,000.00) and Heartland Conservation Alliance, Inc. (\$2,783,940.00) as part of the previously appropriated \$5,100,000.00 ARPA Stormwater Infrastructure Grant award to fund riparian restoration along the Blue River; authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to amend the contracts; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Jensen Adams and Stephaine Dresen, Neighborhood Community Service Department, presented. This ordinance accepts and approves four vendor contracts as part of the previously appropriated \$5,100,000.00 ARPA Stormwater Infrastructure Grant award from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to fund riparian restoration along the Blue River. Due to bandwidth issues within KCPRD, the project was transferred to the Office of Environmental Quality in the Spring of 2024 to administer the overall project. This project closely aligns with several strategies and actions in the City's 2022 Climate Protection & Resiliency Plan (CPRP). Nearly all the strategies under the Natural Systems section of the CPRP apply: N-1 Expand the network of trees and natural areas; N-2 Promote regenerative, ecologically healthy soils and landscapes; N-3 Promote sustainable water supply and use; and N-4 Use natural systems to manage stormwater runoff. Therefore, OEQ worked closely with MDNR and the four nonprofit grant partners to complete the necessary paperwork to obligate the funds and accept the grant award as required by the statutory deadline of December 31, 2024. Amending Chapter 70, Code of Ordinances, by enacting a new Section 70-571 for the purpose of authorizing the establishment of or removal of transit-only lanes to be utilized exclusively for mass transit vehicles such as streetcars and buses.

Councilman Eric Bunch, Jason Waldron, Public Works, and Lace Cline, Mayor's Office, presented. This ordinance amends Chapter 70, Code of Ordinances, by enacting a new Section 70-151. The new section authorizes the establishment of or removal of transit-only lanes to be utilized exclusively for mass transit vehicles such as streetcars and buses. The use of dedicated transit-only lanes is crucial for promoting the efficient and reliable operation of public transportation systems, ensuring timely and equitable access for all commuters, and reducing traffic congestion. It is in the publics interest to implement measures that prioritize public transit and protect the integrity of these designated lanes for the exclusive use of authorized transit vehicles, ensuring that transportation resources are used efficiently for the benefit of the community.
