Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$1,814,298.16 construction contract with Leath & Sons, Inc., for the Water Main Replacement in the Area of E. 50th Terrace to Swope Parkway, E. 55th Street to The Paseo Boulevard project; and authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$1,995,727.98.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this construction project to improve distribution system reliability, increase hydraulic conveyance capacity, and support fire protection to replace aging, break-prone cast iron pipe (CIP) water mains with ductile iron pipe (DIP).

<u>Project Description</u>

This project includes the replacement of approximately 4,709 linear feet (LF) of 6-inch, 8-inch, and 12-inch break-prone cast iron pipe (CIP) transmission water main with 16-inch ductile iron pipe (DIP) transmission water main in the area of E. 50th Terrace to Swope Parkway, E. 55th Street to The Paseo Boulevard, in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

The specific mains to be replaced and other distribution system improvements within the project limits consist of the following:

- Replace 994 LF of 6-inch CIP with 115 LF of 6-inch DIP and 879 LF of 8-inch DIP along The Paseo Boulevard between E. 50th Street and E. 51st Street;
- Replace 622 LF of 8-inch CIP with 8-inch DIP along E. 51st Street between Brookwood Avenue and Highland Avenue;
- Replace 469 LF of 6-inch CIP with 8-inch DIP along Highland Avenue between Brookwood Avenue and E. 51st Street;
- Replace 650 LF of 6-inch CIP with 18 LF of 6-inch DIP and 632 LF of 8-inch DIP along Brookwood Avenue between E. 51st Street and Highland Avenue;
- Replace 812 LF of 6-inch CIP with 112 LF of 6-inch DIP and 700 LF of 8-inch DIP along E. 51st. Street between Indiana Avenue and Swope Parkway; and

 Replace 1262 LF of 6-inch CIP and 143 LF of 12-inch CIP with 410 LF of 6-inch DIP, 852 LF of 8-inch DIP, and 143 LF of 12-inch DIP between E. 55th Steet and Indiana Avenue.

The work will include the transfer of customers' water service connections from existing water mains to new water mains. The amount of this contract is \$1,814,298.16.

<u>Term</u>

The term of this contract is 330 calendar days.

Solicitation

This project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Public bids were opened on February 25, 2025 with 5 bidders responding.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 11% MBE and 11% WBE on this project on January 6, 2025 as part of the Annual Goal Program.

<u>Awardee/Subcontracting Participation</u>

Leath & Sons, Inc. was selected for this project as the lowest, most responsive, and most responsible bidder with a contract amount of \$1,814,298.16, with subcontracting participation of 11% MBE and 11% WBE.

Discussion

Project Justification

The purpose of this project is to modernize Kansas City's Water Treatment Plant by addressing rehabilitation needs, optimizing the treatment process, increasing the treatment capacity from 240 to 270 million gallons per day (mgd), and eliminating restrictions to increase the hydraulic capacity to 300 mgd.

The Water Treatment Plant is located at 1 N.W. Briarcliff Road, Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri.

Design Professional Services Project Description/Executed Contract Summary

Executive Summary

Accepting and approving four vendor contracts as part of the previously appropriated \$5,100,000.00 ARPA Stormwater Infrastructure Grant award from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources to fund riparian restoration along the Blue River and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

In 2021 Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), a \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus bill designed to speed up the American economic recovery after the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the co-occurring recession. Within specific categories such as support for public health expenditures, addressing negative economic impacts caused by COVID-19, replacing lost public sector revenue, and investing in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure, states and local governments have flexibility to decide how best to use their funding to meet the needs of their communities. As part of ARPA, Missouri received approximately \$2.7 billion in State Fiscal Recovery Funds for a variety of approved grant programs.

In the spring of 2022, the Kansas City Parks & Recreation Department (KCPRD) was approached by four local nonprofit organizations with a grant proposal under the state's ARPA Stormwater Infrastructure Grant. This program is administered by the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) using ARPA funds for projects requiring necessary stormwater infrastructure improvements. KCPRD worked closely with the four nonprofit partners to fine-tune the proposal and submitted it in the summer of 2022. The final proposal seeks to restore 200 acres of riparian habitat along the Blue River, improve green infrastructure in three nodes along the Blue River corridor, and plant 2,000 trees along the corridor. This project will span across Council Districts 3, 5, and 6. In the fall of 2022, the City found out it was selected for an award of \$5,000,000.00 for its project proposal.

Due to bandwidth issues within KCPRD, the project was transferred to the Office of Environmental Quality in the Spring of 2024 to administer as the overall project

closely aligns with a number of strategies and actions in the City's 2022 Climate Protection & Resiliency Plan (CPRP). Nearly all the strategies under the Natural Systems section of the CPRP apply: N-1 Expand the network of trees and natural areas; N-2 Promote regenerative, ecologically healthy soils and landscapes; N-3 Promote sustainable water supply and use; and N-4 Use natural systems to manage stormwater runoff. Therefore, OEQ worked closely with MDNR and the four nonprofit grant partners to complete the necessary paperwork to obligate the funds and accept the grant award as required by the statutory deadline of December 31, 2024.

The City is now ready to award the vendor contracts to the four nonprofit partners that were named in the application and have worked on it since its inception. OEQ has sought all the proper approvals including a solicitation waiver from the City's Procurement Office and permission to use a noncompetitive bid process with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. These documents will be attached to the ordinance materials.

Additionally, as part of the paperwork necessary to accept the award, OEQ sought approval from the Parks Board to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Department, as some of the work will be done on County property. That was approved through Resolution #32663 on October 8, 2024.

Service Level Impacts

The project will restore 200 acres of riparian zone along the Blue River. The green infrastructure enhancements and riparian restoration will improve channel stability, reduce peak velocities during storm events, and provide water quality benefits for nonpoint source pollution – all of which will benefits surrounding communities by reducing the impacts of flooding during storm events. In addition, the enhancements will add to green infrastructure previously implemented by the Smart Sewer Program in the Blue River basin under Kansas City's Consent Decree, addressing critical combined sewer water quality issues for residents. Importantly, riparian restoration will also help reduce flood flows and pollutant loads from upstream areas in Kansas that are beyond the scope of the City's Smart Sewer and Consent Decree activities.

Additionally, the project is adjacent to HUD Qualified Census Tracts (QCTs), particularly the northern section, which is entirely encompassed by QCTs. In fact, low-income households are isolated and highly concentrated in six Kansas City zip codes, four of which are addressed by this project. This will therefore enhance equitable access to nature. Riparian restoration and native plant demonstration gardens will help generate recreation opportunities in both planned and grassroots ways along the Blue River Greenway.

Finally, as part of the project, vendors/contractors will be working with communities surrounding the project area to provide educational opportunities about the benefits of green infrastructure. Both trees and native plants will be provided to interested citizens and consultations with Nature Advisors will help interested residents determine the best locations and species of native plants for their properties.

Other Impacts

1. What will be the potential health impacts to any affected groups?

Reducing the impacts of flooding during storm events could have an impact on affected groups by reducing the mold and mildew build-up due to standing water, thus improving air quality in homes with regular flooding. Water quality

will be improved as less sewer overflows will be diverted to the river during storm events if we are not overloading the combined sewer water system. Additionally, increased tree canopy and native plants will ultimately help reduce the urban heat island effect and the local impacts of climate change. This will improve public health in our City by reducing the impact of heat-related health issues caused by climate change. Finally, it has been shown that access to natural spaces improves mental health. As we are in a national mental health crisis, increasing access to natural areas will provide the public with more ways of combatting these issues.

- How have those groups been engaged and involved in the development of this ordinance?
 Residents were not directly engaged in the development of the project proposal. However, the proposal was built off the strategies listed in the City's CPRP, which was heavily influenced by public outreach and feedback during its development in 2022.
- 3. How does this legislation contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?
 As stated throughout the Docket Memo, this is ultimately a sustainability project. While it is a stormwater infrastructure project, it largely contributes to a more sustainable Kansas City as it aligns with all the strategies laid out in the Natural Systems section of the City's Climate Protection & Resiliency Plan.
 - 1. N-1: It will expand our network of trees and natural areas, thus helping to increase the City's urban forest/canopy, reduce the urban heat island effect, and increase the effectiveness of pervious land areas for water absorption.
 - 2. N-2: It will promote regenerative, ecologically healthy soils and landscapes by removing invasive species and replacing them with native plants that will better support the local ecosystem of plants and animals.
 - 3. N-3: It will promote sustainable water supply and use by planting natives that don't require additional watering and that help filter non-point source pollution so that less processing is needed further down the chain.
 - 4. N-4: It will use natural systems to manage stormwater runoff be providing natural sinks that help to soak up water during storm events, sending less to the combined sewer system which reduces the chance of overflows and the need for increased wastewater processing downstream.

Consenting to the creation of a port improvement district overlaying certain real property generally located east of the Christopher S. Bond Bridge and leased to Port KC for the purpose of imposing a 1% sales and use tax; directing the City Manager to support the creation of the port improvement district; and directing the City Manager to cast a ballot, on behalf of the City, in favor of the sales and use tax.

WHEREAS, the Port Authority of Kansas City, Missouri is authorized by the Port Improvement District Act, Sections 68.200 et seq., RSMo, ("Act") to petition the circuit court for the creation of a special taxing district ("PID"); and

WHEREAS, Bally's and the proposed developer of a hotel adjacent to the casino currently sublease, or will sublease, certain real property generally located east of the Christoper S. Bond Bridge and have requested the creation of a new PID for the purpose of generating revenues to fund the costs to be incurred in the design and construction of the hotel, with any additional revenues being utilized to make public improvements as authorized by the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that any petition to create a PID have the consent of the relevant property owners; and

WHEREAS, upon court approval of the PID, the City, in its capacity as the property owner, will have the right to cast a ballot in support of the 1% sales and use tax; and

WHEREAS, the creation of the PID will impose no monetary obligations on the City and will assist in generating revenues that will enhance and maintain a publicly owned asset; NOW, THEREFORE,

Section 1. That pursuant to Section 68.210.2, RSMo., the City consents to the filing of a petition for approval of a port improvement district as contemplated herein and that would be authorized to seek voter approval for a 1% sales and use tax.

Amending Chapter 70, Code of Ordinances, by enacting a new Section 70-571 for the purpose of authorizing the establishment of or removal of transit-only lanes to be utilized exclusively for mass transit vehicles such as streetcars and buses.

WHEREAS, the use of dedicated transit-only lanes is crucial for promoting the efficient and reliable operation of public transportation systems, ensuring timely and equitable access for all commuters, and reducing traffic congestion; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to implement measures that prioritize public transit and protect the integrity of these designated lanes for the exclusive use of authorized transit vehicles, ensuring that transportation resources are used efficiently for the benefit of the community; and

WHEREAS, City Council passed Resolution No. 230625 on August 3, 2023, directing the City Manager to coordinate with the Kansas City Area Transit Authority and the Kansas City Streetcar Authority to produce design alternatives for transit exclusive lanes to be considered for incorporation in the streetcar extension from Pershing Road to 51st Street and requiring a report back to City Council within 90 days and expressing Council's support for a vehicular design speed no greater than 30 miles per hour along the expanded Streetcar route; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KANSAS CITY:

Section 1. That Chapter 70, Code of Ordinances of the City of Kansas City, Missouri, is hereby amended by enacting Section 70-571, Transit-Only Lanes, to read as follows:

Sec. 70-571. Transit-Only Lanes.

- (a) The director is hereby authorized to establish or remove transit-only lanes in such places and in such manner as the director determines to be of the greatest benefit and convenience to the public. The director is authorized to promulgate regulations which may be necessary for effecting the purposes of this section.
- (b) Transit-only lanes shall serve as dedicated lanes reserved exclusively for public mass transportation vehicles such as buses and streetcars.

- (c) Transit-only lanes shall be designed and constructed following specific design standards including lane width, signage, and pavement marking.
- (d) A person may not operate or park a passenger car, truck, motorcycle, moped, bicycle, motorized bicycle or any other motor vehicle in, on or across a designated transit-only lane except:
 - (1) To enter or leave a driveway, building, alley, or turn lane; or
 - (2) To enter or leave an on-street parking space; or
 - (3) To cross the street or streetcar tracks at authorized crossings; or
 - (4) For a bus, to enter or leave a bus stop.
- (e) Anyone found to be in violation of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50.00 and the vehicle may be towed at the owner's expense.
- (f) In all cases a person may not walk or drive on or cross a transit-only lane under this section without first yielding the right-of-way, if necessary, to avoid collision or interference with bus or streetcar traffic.
