Reason for Legislation

Authorizing a funding agreement with the Tax Increment Financing Commission for the construction of the Second Creek Trail.

Resolution 130443 created the Twin Creeks KC Task Force which met over two years to discuss infrastructure and development issues in the First and Second Creek watersheds.

The Task Force reported back to the City Council and a major component of the Twin Creeks KC Development Task Force final report and recommendations to the Council was implementation of a linear park and trail system which would connect to the Line Creek and 152 Trail systems to Platte Purchase Park.

The City is going to partner with Platte County and the TIF Commission to begin construction of the first phase of the Second Creek Trail which is a part of the Twin Creeks Greenway System.

How will this contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?

This project will contribute to a sustainable Kansas City by extending the bike/ped transportation network and connecting the neighborhoods of Genesis at Green Hills to the Route 152 and Line Creek Trails, Platte Purchase Park, and the commercial hubs at I-29/152. The project will also connect residents to the Line Creek Trail which connects to the Missouri River.
