Executive Summary

Authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute a \$1,000,000.00 professional, specialized or technical services contract with the Mid America Assistance Coalition, for the Low Income Assistance Program for a one-year term; approving three successive one-year renewal options with further Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification/Project Description

The City Council established the Water Services Utility Funding Task Force in 2016 to integrate community values into a funding strategy for its water, wastewater, and stormwater utilities.

The Water Services Utility Funding Task Force recommended increasing the amount of customer assistance to benefit eligible low-income households to help pay their water, wastewater, and stormwater utility bills.

The Water Services Department (WSD) desires to continue a public assistance program to aid low-income residents in payment of their water bills. WSD wants to contract with one umbrella social service agency, which then coordinates assistance with the other local social services agencies.

The Mid America Assistance Coalition (MAAC), a not-for-profit corporation, is the coordinating agency for emergency assistance organizations and homeless services providers in the Kansas City area. WSD sets the eligibility criteria and then sends payments to MAAC. Through MAAC, local social service agencies will be able to access a database and tap into the funds when a client meets the eligibility criteria. The social service agency will then write the check to WSD on behalf of the client.

MAAC has distributed utility funds to Kansas City area agencies since 1982, and currently provides this assistance service for Evergy, formerly known as KCP & L and others. MAAC uses MAACLink, a centralized computer database system to fund and

track performance of area agencies and the distribution of financial resources. Currently, their system links funding sources through more than fifty (50) agencies in the local service area. Through this program, they are able to meet our reporting requirements for all monies provided.

<u>Term</u>

The term of this project will be 365 days for the initial contract. This contract will also have three successive one-year renewal options with further City Council approval. The amount of funding for future contracts will be determined at that time, subject to the availability and appropriation of funds in future annual budgets.

Solicitation

A solicitation waiver was approved by the City Manager on May 1, 2024 pursuant to Code of Ordinances 3-3(d)(3) and 3-7(2)(d). There is only one source for this service.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC approved a waiver of goals on June 11, 2024 based on this contract is with a non-profit company.

Estimated Project Cost

The City's estimated cost for this project will not exceed \$1,000,000.00.
