Executive Summary

Authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute a \$2,000,000.00 construction contract with SHEDIGS IT, LLC, for the Emergency Large Diameter Water System Repair project; authorizing four successive renewal options with further City Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this construction project to make scheduled and emergency repairs to the transmission water mains throughout the City's water distribution system.

Project Description

This work will assist the Water Services Department Pipeline Division repair efforts to repair or replace water transmission assets, including large valves. On occasion, work may also include repairs to small distribution system assets.

Work will be performed throughout Kansas City, in Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte Counties, Missouri.

Unit prices for the work to be completed under this contract were set based on the bids received. Therefore, the Water Services Department proposes a not to exceed \$2,000,000.00 contract to complete work orders.

Term

The term of this contract is 365 calendar days. The contract also has four successive one-year renewal options in it.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 11% MBE and 11% WBE on this project on March 9, 2026 as part of the Annual Goal Program.

Solicitation

This project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Public bids were opened on April 7, 2026 with 4 bidders responding.

Awardee/Subcontracting Participation

SHEDIGS IT, LLC was selected for this project as the lowest, most responsive, and most responsible bidder with a contract amount of \$1,326,286.00, with subcontracting participation of 11% MBE and 25% WBE.

Unit prices for the work to be completed under this contract were set based on the bids received.
