Hi my name is Skyler Mart. I'm a resident of KC in the 2nd district. I'm here today to oppose the ordinance proposals for a new temporary jail.

Instead of investing in a temporary jail, I'd like to see money go toward long term solutions that provide stable housing, mental and general health supports, and economic stability for those who may be likely to commit a city offense. Research shows that there is a connection between poverty and crime. Most crimes occured out of a lack of material necessities. We need to adequately address the root causes of crime instead hyper-fixating on punishment. I am a full time teacher and have to work part time as a bar tender just to get by. Times are hard for us all right now. People who have lived here all their lives are being priced out.
