Executive Summary

Directing the City Manager to work in collaboration with the Historic Northeast Coalition to coordinate strategies to prevent fires and the chronic outbreak of fires in the historic northeast of the City and its surrounding areas.

Discussion

From November 2024 through January 2025 the historic northeast of the City, and its surrounding areas, has experienced a total of 78 structure fires in residential, commercial, vacant and occupied buildings, and has also experienced fires in vacant lots and alleys, specifically within the City zip codes of 64106, 64123, 64124, 64125, 64126 and 64127. There have been various causes of these fires, and many causes remain undetermined. The Council believes that the best way to help prevent fires and the chronic outbreak of fires in the historic northeast of the City is for the City Manager to develop coordinated strategies across multiple City Departments in collaboration with the Historic Northeast Coalition.
