Executive Summary

Amending Chapter 10, Code of Ordinances, Alcoholic Beverages, by repealing and replacing Sections 10-1, 10-130, and 10-142 and repealing Section 10-141 for the purpose of allowing an agent capable of representing and binding a corporation or other entity during all interactions or proceedings with the director or a designated representative dealing with the provisions of chapter 10, and, authorizing the director to approve the expansion of premises for parking lots and greenspace previously granted temporary approval pursuant to Section 10-142.

Discussion

This ordinance amends Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances to allow an agent who is capable of representing and binding a corporation or other entity during all interactions or proceedings to meet directly with the director or a designated representative when dealing with the provisions of chapter 10, and, outlines requirements and procedures for expansion of businesses onto parking lots and public greenspace. The ordinance establishes approval criteria for the Neighborhood Services director to authorize an expansion license.
