SECTION III

SERVICES PROVIDED DURING THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR:

The Truman Road CID continued to focus on its core service areas of beautification, security, marketing, and development. Standard services included weekly trash and debris collection, private security patrols, and landscaping maintenance. The CID also supported property owners through grant programs such as façade improvement assistance and vacant lot cleanup support.

This year marked the third year of the "Truman Road Has Heart" marketing campaign, which has grown to include expanded community engagement, crime prevention programming, and business spotlights highlighting the diverse stakeholders along the corridor. The CID also worked closely with KCPD, KCMO Fire, Hope Faith Ministries, the Land Bank, and other partners to address encampments and public safety concerns. These collaborative efforts led to the successful relocation of several homeless camps and trash debris removal. In addition, the CID advanced its work through the Rebuild KC grant with a focus on crime prevention and continued its partnership with KC Common Good to develop a comprehensive safety plan tailored to our corridor.

The district also undertook significant new initiatives, including preparing for the removal of bike lanes along Truman Road beginning September 1, 2025, to improve traffic flow and accessibility, as well as reviewing private security services and investing in a district-wide security camera program to enhance safety.

Beautification efforts expanded with a new partnership with Bridging the Gap, launching a tree-planting initiative to improve the natural environment along the common entryways of the Guadalupe School campus and Elmwood Cemetery. The CID also continued its beautification and anti-dumping programs to protect property values and enhance pedestrian safety.

Finally, the Truman Road CID strengthened regional collaboration by hosting and participating in the KC CID Alliance, while expanding outreach to property owners and businesses to ensure they have direct support and representation in corridor planning.
