MCH Services: Key Achievements (2025)

Direct support through weekly office hours

- safe sleep education and resources
- child safety (including car seat installations)
- doula referrals
- individualized family support and connection to community resources

200+ families served in 2025 through outreach and direct support

The program's impact in 2025 demonstrates rapid growth, strong community engagement, and a clear demand for accessible maternal and child health services.

NFP Program Outcomes (2025)

Pregnancy

- **8% preterm birth rate** (compared to **11% statewide**)

Breastfeeding

- **92% breastfeeding initiation rate**
- **53% breastfeeding continuation at 6 months** (compared to **27% statewide**)

Child Health

- **100% immunization rate at 24 months** (compared to **68.6% statewide**)
- **0% emergency room visits or hospitalizations** related to injury or ingestion

Child Development

- **100% of children were screened every 2 months** for developmental delays (0-24 months)

Self-Sufficiency

- **80% of clients 17 years and younger** who did not have HS diploma or GED at enrollment, **were enrolled in school or had earned a diploma by 24 months postpartum**
