Children & Youth with Special Health

Care Needs Service Coordination

Regions 1 and 2

Reason for Legislation

This ordinance is to accept and approve two contract amendments with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to provide Service Coordination for Children With Special Health Care Needs for the period of July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019. The first amount of \$61,000.00, will be used to provide services in Region 1 counties which consist of Atchison, Nodaway, Worth, Harrison, Gentry, Holt, Andrew, Dekalb, Davies, Buchanan, Clinton, and Caldwell. The second amount of \$118,000.00, will be used to provide services in Region 2 counties which consist of Platte, Clay, Ray, Jackson, and Cass.

Discussion

This funding from the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services funds coordination services for children with special health care needs who live in the following counties: Atchison, Nodaway, Worth, Harrison, Gentry, Holt, Andrew, Dekalb, Davies, Buchanan, Clinton, Caldwell, Jackson, Ray, Clay, Platte, and Cass. The purpose of the contract amendments is to provide services for children who are at increased risk of chronic, physical, developmental, behavioral, or emotional conditions who require health related services beyond that required by children generally; to assist children and families to identify when appropriate to access necessary services and supports to increase health care options and to partner with community-based systems to assist in transitions in all aspects of life. The child must qualify medically, and the family must meet income guidelines. Both amendments allow the department to fund two full-time case managers.

Is it good for the children?

Many of the Health Departments programs are specifically designed for the betterment of health in all citizens. This Program specifically targets the health of children from ages <u>birth</u> to <u>21</u> years of age. In addition, the program assist families in collaborating with needed resources, supports and services according to individualized needs which offers empowerment for the participant and family.

How will this contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?

Many public health programs are funded based on the need of the community and the impact upon individual citizens and high risk groups. Promoting economic vitality, social equity and environmental quality in addressing public health initiatives is oftentimes dependent upon federal, state and local funding; however, the goal of these programs is to promote and protect all citizens of Kansas City on a continuing, ongoing and sustainable basis. This shared opportunity and responsibility yields enhanced value to the children served, individuals, families, groups and overall community.
