The City has been awarded an additional \$156,900.00 from the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission and will receive an additional \$319,795.31 from the Village of Platte Woods for project construction. These funds will be estimated and appropriated accordingly to ensure accurate financial tracking and project completion.

Discussion

Ordinance 210290 estimated revenue in the amount of \$685,200.00 into the Capital Improvements Sales Tax Fund; appropriating that amount to the Route 9 Prairie View Road to Platte Woods - Sidewalk Project accounts; authorizing execution of an Intergovenmental Cooperative Agreement with the City of Platte Woods for the design and construction of this project; authorizing execution of a Transportation Alternatives Funds Program Agreement (TAP) with the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission, Grant Number STP 3301(483) for the construction of this project. The original City of Platte Woods cost share was \$235,200.00 and the TAP funding was \$450,000.00 in 2021. Since that time project design and construction costs have increased requiring additional funding to deliver the project. Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$1,999,600.00 construction contract with MegaKC Corporation, for the Water Treatment Plant - House Service Main Project; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification

The City's Water Treatment Plant was built in the 1920s. It sources all water from the Missouri River or nearby wells, treats it, and delivers finished water/drinking water to the ratepayers of the City of Kansas City, Missouri. Finished water is delivered to the ratepayers, and services plant industrial process equipment, fire hydrants, water closets/bathrooms, and drinking fountains.

Due to severity of consequences of pipe failure, the complexity of water hammer analysis, construction sequencing, and the desire to allocate risk to one entity, the City decided there is benefit in utilizing a Design-Build method for the project and a Fixed-Price Design-Build (FPDB) method was selected. The FPDB method was chosen to allow Water Services Department staff involvement in the design process for the project while leveraging the schedule, collaboration, and other advantages that result from use of a design-build process.

The Water Treatment Plant, is located at 1 N.W. Briarcliff Road, Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri.

Project Description

This project will provide Design-Builder Services for design and construction of the following scope of work:

 Inspection of direct buried house service main segments between settling basins and the Water Treatment Plant's Chemical Building.

- Demolition and removal of existing facilities as indicated and necessary for the construction of the project, including concrete penetrations, pipe racks, pipe supports, and out-of-service or abandoned piping as indicated for replacement.
- Pipe condition assessment of the direct buried house service main. Any faulty segments identified from the pipe condition assessment shall be repaired and/or replaced.

replacement, due to contract lapse. These vehicles are used in Solid Waste collection, Street maintenance and repairs, City tree maintenance and various Neighborhood services.

 Yes, it has impacts both in expenditure and cost avoidance. Fiscal impact cannot be estimated for either cited topic as we aren't sure of provided purchase funding going forward. But be aware that expenditure on new equipment positively impacts operational costs due to reduction of downtime and repair expenses (incurred by obsolete/out of life-cycle equipment).

 Yes, indirectly generates revenue. As equipment is replaced it is remarketed at public auction, recovering a percentage of original investment based on current market value.
