### Executive Summary

Waiving a certain procedure of the City's Arterial Street Impact Fee Code; appropriating \$636,000.00 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance of the Arterial Street Impact Fee Fund to an account in the Arterial Street Impact Fee Fund; authorizing an amendment in the amount of \$987,269.76 for inspection services with TREKK Design Group for the Lee's Summit Road – NW Lakewood Boulevard to NW Anderson Drive project.

### Discussion

This ordinance authorizes the uses of unappropriated arterial street impact fee funds that are available in the East Development District (F). Since no appropriations were recommended prior to FY 2022 or FY 2023 budget adoption as required by Chapter 39 of the Code of Ordinances, this ordinance seeks to waive the requirement for a committee meeting and designate funding available within that district only.

Authorizing the Director of Public Works to execute a contract amendment to increase the contract amount by \$987,269.76 for inspection services with TREKK Design Group for Lee's Summit Rd – Lakewood to Anderson. This will provide for consultant inspection services to supplement the City's forces for the reconstruction contract that is being approved by a companion ordinance.
