### Executive Summary

Waiving the limitations established by the Fund Balance and Reserve Policy in Section 2-1954 of the Code of Ordinances; authorizing the City Manager to execute a \$366,000.00 sole source contract renewal option with Emergency Medicine Services of MO, LLC to provide EMS Medical Director services for Kansas City's EMS system and EMS Education Program; authorizing the City Manager to amend the Contract and exercise the City's six (6) one (1) year renewal options; appropriating \$366,000.00 from the Health Fund (2330) unappropriated fund balance; designating requisitioning authority and recognizing an accelerated effective date.

This ordinance allows the city to enter into a contract for an emergency medical director and staff for the the city's emergency medical services.

The City requires ([Sec 2-1954 \(f\)\(4\)\(B\)\(ii\)](#)) the Health Fund (2330) to have a minimum fund balance of 8% reserve or \$7,752,229 in FY2026 or for City Council to waive that requirement.
