Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$799,500.00 general services contract with Environmental Works, Inc., for the Water Treatment Plant Basin Cleaning, Renewal No. 2 project; authorizing three successive one-year renewal options with further City Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

Project Justification

Contracting of bi-annual cleaning process allows the Water Supply Division to utilize skilled personnel more effectively; freeing limited resources (staff) to perform much needed preventative and predictive maintenance on pumps and motors throughout the water supply system. This contract will also decrease work orders by proactively cleaning and maintaining the system reducing wear and tear on equipment.

Project Description

Lime precipitates in our Secondary and Final Basins as expected in the softening process. Over twelve months precipitated Lime accumulates in the bottom of the basins requiring two basin cleaning sessions annually.

The scope of services consists of cleaning the following at Kansas City's Water Treatment Plant: primary basins, primary flumes (tunnels), secondary basins, secondary effluent chamber, diffuser basins, final influent chamber, final basins, and the effluent chamber. One treatment train at a time is cleaned and occurs two times per year. The cleaning period lasts for eight weeks each time.

This ordinance is for approval of the original contract and three successive one-year renewals at the City's option with additional Council approval. Each renewal pricing will be based on the annual Consumer Price Index amount.

This proposed ordinance also is requesting an accelerated effective date in order to expedite execution of the contract to align with the basin cleaning season.

The Water Treatment Plant is located at 1 N.W. Briarcliff Road, in Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri.

<u>Term</u>

The term of this project is 365 calendar days.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 11% MBE and 11% WBE on this general services project on July 19, 2022 as part of the Annual Goal Program.

Original Solicitation/Selection

This project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Public bids were opened on September 7, 2022 with 2 bidders responding.

Environmental Works, Inc. was selected for this project as the lowest, most responsive, and most responsible bidder.

The only other bidder whom submitted on the original bid was Wastewater Specialties, LLC. Their bid was in the amount of \$2,102,880.00.

Prior Legislation

City Council approved Ordinance No. 220767 on September 22, 2022, which authorized a \$799,500.00 general services contract with Environmental Works, Inc., for the Water

Treatment Plant Basin Cleaning contract; authorized five successive one-year renewal options with further City Council approval; and directed the Director of Water Services Department to report back to City Council efforts made to expand staffing, a list of equipment needs, and the fiscal impact to insource the Water Treatment Plant Basin Cleaning tasks.

City Council approved Ordinance No. 230587 on August 3, 2023, which authorized a \$799,500.00 Renewal No. 1 to the general services contract with Environmental Works, Inc., for the Water Treatment Plant Basin Cleaning project; authorized four successive one-year renewal options with further City Council approval; directed the Director of Water Services Department to report back on the Department's progress in hiring individuals in otder to be able to insource the Water Treatment Plant Basin Cleaning tasks.
