Executive Summary

Appropriating \$400,000.00 from the Unappropriated Fund Balance of the Public Safety Sales Tax Fund to fund design professional services for the Community Resource Center Project; authorizing the Manager of Procurement Services to execute a \$400,000.00 design professional services contract with Multistudio, Inc., for the design of the Community Resource Center; designating requisitioning authority; directing the City Manager to identify up to \$5,600,000.00 from the Public Safety Sales Tax or other fund sources for future contract amendments; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date..

Discussion

Resolution No. 240896 directed the City Manager to analyze the feasibility of developing parcels in close proximity to the municipal courthouse for the purpose of a Community Resource Center; and

Several parcels adjacent to or nearby the courthouse were identified as viable options; and

Resolution No. 250232 directed the City Manager to issue a Request for Qualifications/Proposals for the design of a Community Resource Center; and the City received 6 proposals in response to the RFQ/P request; after review, the evaluation committee recommended the proposal of Multistudio,. The Special Committee on the Municipal Rehabilitation and Detention Center recommended that the Public Safety Sales Tax be used to construct a Community Resource Center at a central location. A Community Resource Center will efficiently and effectively connect justice-involved individuals and vulnerable residents with necessary resources and treatment. Facilitating connection to resources and treatment will improve public safety and reduce recidivism by addressing root causes of unlawful behavior; and

The City Council is committed to establishing a Community Resource Center as part of a holistic public safety strategy.
