Executive Summary

Approving a plan of finance for City's contribution to the Northland Workforce Development Center; establishing Fund No. 3456, 2026A Taxable Special Obligation Bond Fund; estimating and appropriating bond proceeds in the amount of \$29,500,000.00 for the purpose of providing the City's contribution to the project; authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement to establish certain conditions for the City's contribution; directing the City Manager, as necessary, to identify in the initial quarterly budget clean-up sources to fill any funding gaps existing in project delivery; and declaring the effective date of this ordinance to be May 1, 2025.

Discussion

On February 13, 2025, the City Council adopted Committee Substitute for Ordinance No. 250132 directing the City Manager to develop a plan of finance to support the development of the new workforce development facility in an amount not to exceed \$30,000,000.00. The total cost of the new workforce development facility is estimated to be approximately \$74,000,000.00 and the State of Missouri has appropriated \$37,000,000.00 towards the development of a Northland Workforce Development Center with the balance to come from \$7 million in private donations and a City contribution. The City Council allocated \$500,000.00 as a contribution to the Northland Workforce Development Center through its FY2024-25 Adopted Budget and said contribution was made on October 16, 2024, reducing the City's current contribution for the project to an amount not to exceed \$29,500,000.00 with said contribution being counted toward the estimated \$7 million in private donations. The City desires to support the project but will have no responsibility for maintenance or operation of the facility and will impose certain conditions to reflect the level of contribution being made by the City. The Finance Department has developed several options for a plan of finance to fund debt service on bonds issued to provide cash for the City's contribution and the City Council desires to approve the plan outlined in Attachment A to this ordinance.
