### Executive Summary

Estimating revenue in the amount of \$1,500,000.00 in the Capital Improvements Grant Fund; appropriating that amount to the Cliff Drive Bike/Pedestrian Facility to River Market Connector project; designating requisitioning authority; recognizing the required local grant match; and declaring this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

### Discussion

The project will provide bicycle and pedestrian connection between the Cliff Drive corridor and the River Market area. This ordinance estimates and appropriates \$1,500,000.00 in grant funding for the Cliff Drive Bike/Pedestrian Facility to River Market Connector project. The City has been awarded Grant No. TAP-3001(011) through the Missouri Department of Transportation, consisting of \$750,000.00 from the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) and \$750,000.00 from the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) program.
