Executive Summary

Approving the petition to establish the Grey Oaks Community Improvement District; establishing the Grey Oaks Community Improvement, generally located at the east of North Oak Trafficway and south of Northeast 79th Terrace in Kansas City, Clay County, Missouri; determining the Grey Oaks Community Improvement District to be a blighted area; determining that certain actions are reasonably anticipated to remediate blighting conditions and will serve a public purpose; requiring the annual submission of certain records; and directing the City Clerk to report the creation of the Grey Oaks Community Improvement District to the Missouri Department of Economic Development and the Missouri State Auditor.

Discussion

This ordinance would approve the petition to establish the Grey Oaks Crossing CID for a 27-year term, unless extended. This would be a single-parcel CID located at 7801 N Oak Trfy in the 2nd District. This CID would not overlap any other CID. There is only one property owner so the petition was signed by 100% of property owners within the boundaries who owns 100% of the assessed property value. The petition and associated documents meet State and City requirements.

The CID is seeking a blight determination. The cited blighting conditions include, but are not limited to, deterioration of parking lots and sidewalks, poor drainage, trash/debris, and damage to siding, downspouts, and soffits, among other conditions. The CID is proposing the following improvements which they state will remediate the blighting factors/conditions: HVAC replacement, roof replacement, trash enclosure, concrete, asphalt, electrical, and landscaping.

The District would have the authority to impose a 1% sales tax. The District would not have authority to levy special assessments.
