Discussion

The Kansas City Health Department was selected after Sept 11 2001 to be the recipient of a Cities Readiness Initiative where planning and preparedness efforts are to be focused on providing a quick response to the Kansas City public for a variety of hazards including providing medications during an intentional biological attack or a natural epidemic such as a novel strain of influenza or other novel disease. These funds are dedicated to staffing planners who develop a plan to respond to any public health emergency, to work with and coordinate with local emergency management to provide a public health component as a first responder agency. These plans become part of the City's overall response to emergencies. The staff also provide technical assistance to other counties in the metropolitan area to improve their capacity and response.

This ordinance is to accept a contract with the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services to develop response plans to provide prophylaxis to the citizens and visitors of Kansas City within 24-48 hours of an intentional biological attack. These plans should allow a quick and enhanced ability to respond to and recover from allhazards, including an intentional biological attach or natural epidemic.

Is it good for the children?

Many of the Health Departments programs are specifically designed for the betterment of health in all citizens. This Program specifically targets the health in both adults and children.

How will this contribute to a sustainable Kansas City?

Many public health programs are funded based on the need of the community and the impact upon individual citizens and high risk groups. Promoting economic vitality, social equity and environmental quality in addressing public health initiatives is oftentimes dependent upon federal, state and local funding; however, the goal of these programs is to promote and protect all citizens of Kansas City on a continuing, ongoing and sustainable basis.
