Executive Summary

Estimating revenue in the amount of \$4,250,000 in the Capital Improvements Grant Fund and appropriating that amount for the Swope Park Improvements project to the same fund.

Discussion

The National Park Service (NPS) Outdoor Recreation Legacy Program (ORLP) has awarded grant funding to the Swope Park Improvements project in the amount of \$4,250,000 contingent on 50/50 matching funds and all grant terms being met. The grant is a reimbursement at the end of the project provided that grant terms are satisfied to the terms of the grantor. This project will include design and construction of improvements to the northwest portion of the park and will include of a new trail, a destination playground, renovations to five shelters and the bandstand, and pedestrian and bicycle safety interventions along access roads. This project requires a local match of \$4,250,000. Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MoDNR) is the administrator of the grant funds on behalf of NPS and assisted with application for this grant.
