Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$3,702,158.00 construction contract with Abay Construction Inc., for the Water Main Replacement in the Area of W. 46th Street to W. 50th Street, Liberty Street to Main Street project; and authorizing a maximum expenditure of \$4,072,373.00.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this construction project to improve distribution system reliability, increase hydraulic conveyance capacity, and support fire protection to replace aging, break-prone cast iron pipe (CIP) water mains with ductile iron pipe (DIP).

<u>Project Description</u>

This project includes the replacement of approximately 8,375 linear feet (LF) of 6-inch, 8-inch, and 16-inch break-prone cast iron pipe (CIP) transmission water main with 16-inch ductile iron pipe (DIP) transmission water main in the area of W. 46th Street to W. 50th Street, Liberty Street to Main Street, in Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

The specific mains to be replaced and other distribution system improvements within the project limits consist of the following:

- Replace 1,065 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Broadway Boulevard from West 44th Street to West 45th Street,
- Replace 400 LF of 8-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along West 45th Street from Broadway Boulevard to Wornall Road,
- Replace 570 LF of 8-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Wornall Road from West 45th Street to West 46th Street,
- Replace 1,225 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 6-inch DIP along Liberty Street from West 47th Street to West 49th Street,
- Replace 690 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Madison Avenue from West 46th Street to West 47th Street,

- Replace 1,080 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Roanoke Parkway from West 47th Street to Ward Parkway,
- Replace 450 LF of 16-inch CIP water main with 16-inch DIP along Wornall Road from Ward Parkway to West 49th Street,
- Replace 170 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along Ward Parkway from Wornall Road to West 48th Street,
- Replace 1,200 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along West 49th Street from Ward Parkway to Main Street,
- Replace 700 LF of 8-inch CIP water main with 8-inch DIP along West 49th Street from Wyandotte Street to Main Street and,
- Replace 825 LF of 6-inch CIP water main with 6-inch DIP along West 50th Street from Pennsylvania Avenue to Wornall Road.

The work will include the transfer of customers' water service connections from existing water mains to new water mains. The amount of this contract is \$3,702,158.00.

Term

The term of this contract is 300 calendar days.

Solicitation

This project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. Public bids were opened on January 28, 2025 with 7 bidders responding.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 11% MBE and 11% WBE on this project on July 15, 2024 as part of the Annual Goal Program.

<u>Awardee/Subcontracting Participation</u>

Abay Construction Inc. was selected for this project as the lowest, most responsive, and most responsible bidder with a contract amount of \$3,702,158.00, with subcontracting participation of 11% MBE and 11% WBE.

 - The Front St. Project has been in the design and ROW process for many years. The initial study to improve Front St. included a public mtg. in Nov. 2010 at the Metropolitan Community College. Design work proceeded afterwards and resulting in plans completed in 2018 with a public mtg. with the NE Industrial Assoc. in April 2019. The COVID epidemic stalled the project in 2020 and ROW work began afterwards with Public Works reaching out to the following industries and businesses along Front St.- Evergy, Mars Petcare, Heinson Enterprises, Midwest Terminal Warehouse, HAK Inc., KR Real Estate, Karbank Properties, and CPKC Railroad. ROW acquisitions and easements were obtained for all properties by 2024 and plans were finalized in 2023 after lengthy delays caused by the condemnation process. Additional funding was obtained in 2023 and 2024 to fund the project.
