Executive Summary

Authorizing the City Manager to negotiate and enter into all necessary agreements consistent with this ordinance, including but not limited to a pre-development agreement, development agreement, lease, and any other necessary agreements, with 816 Solar Consortium for development of a solar array on property at the Kansas City International Airport; provide a 180-day period for negotiations; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.

Discussion

This Ordinance provides the City Manager the right to negotiate a lease and Power Purchase Agreement. At this time, there is no agreement for CREO to review and apply MBE/WBE goals. The 816 Solar Consortium has made a commitment in their formal proposal to meet potential MBE/WBE goals.
