Discussion

This work is necessary to relocate the Buckeye pipeline out of the way of the construction of the 104th Street Improvement Project. The pipeline must be relocated before this project construction can begin. Since the Buckeye pipeline is in it's own easement a pipeline relocation agreement is required and Buckeye Pipeline Transportation LLC must be compensated for their cost of relocation of the pipeline. Buckeye has estimated their relocation costs are approximately \$629,294.00.

Is it good for the children? The 104th Street project will provide sidewalks on both sides of the street where there aren't sidewalks now. This will make the street much safer for children as well as other pedestrians.

How will this contribute to a sustainable Kansas City? Sustainability has been included in the design of this project. This agreement with Buckeye will allow this project to move forward.
