Phillip Criddlebaugh, Water Services, presented. This ordinance will allow for a continued partnership with Mid-American Assistance Council. The funding will continue to assist families in paying water bills to ensure services are not disconnected. The funding does not exceed \$500 in a calendar year for the individual billing name and is paid directly to the water company when customers apply through affiliated agencies and meet the need. Amending Chapter 70, Code of Ordinances, entitled “Traffic and Vehicles” by enacting a new section 70-962 entitled “Pedestrian signal programming policies and standards” for the purpose of instituting policies and standards related to pedestrian crossing signals; establishing an effective date; and directing the City Manager to provide periodic updates regarding implementation progress every 45 days to the Transportation, Infrastructure, and Operations Committee.

CM Bunch requested that the Public Works Department develop a plan to modernize the pedestrian walk system with an automatic recall feature. The department was given four weeks to prepare and return to the committee with recommendations. The plan should explore options for automatically triggering the pedestrian walk signal when the light turns green, eliminating the need for pedestrians to press the button. The goal is to implement an automated system that coordinates the walk signal with the traffic light. Additionally, the system should account for approaching public transportation (e.g., streetcars), ensuring pedestrians can catch the vehicle without unnecessary delays caused by waiting for the walk signal.
