Safety Net Providers (SNP)

- Group of external hospitals, and non-for-profit neighborhood health centers who are:
 - Guided by their mission to assure health care accessibility to all regardless of ability to pay
 - Under contract with the City of Kansas City for medical and public healthcare
- Uninsured and underinsured
- SNP can not be used as a replacement of health insurance

Kansas City Health Safety Net Providers

- 6 Safety Net Providers provide medical care to the underserved population of KCMO



SNP's Compensation

- **Monthly Reporting**

Each SNP must report monthly patients and patient visit encounters along with their financial statements to receive the payment allocation.

- **Monthly Payment**

Each contracted SNP healthcare provider receives a monthly payment allocation from the third tier of the Health Levy for the serving the eligible uninsured and underinsured eligible residents of Kansas City health levy encounters.

- **Patient Acknowledgment**

The SNP's are required to notify all health levy eligible patients or clients that some or part of their care may be funded by the City of Kansas City.

Who can use the Health Levy Dollars?

- 1. Must be a verified resident of Kansas City, MO
in the last 365 days**
- 2. Must have income that falls under 400% of the
Federal Poverty Level**

What type of services are covered?

- Medical
- Dental
- Vision
- Mental/Behavioral Health
- Maternal Health

Authorizing the Director of Health to enter into contracts with area health centers to include Children's Mercy Hospital, Northland Health Care Access, Swope Parkway Health Center, Kansas City CARE Clinic, Samuel U. Rodgers Health Center, and University Health, to provide primary health care services to uninsured residents in Kansas City, Missouri; authorizing the Director of Health to extend the term of the contracts or increase the total contract dollar amounts upon need and appropriation without further Council approval; and recognizing this ordinance as having an accelerated effective date.
