Executive Summary

Authorizing a \$1,105,746.00 design professional services contract with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc., for the Blue River Odor Control Phase III project.

Discussion

Project Justification

The Water Services Department is undertaking this design professional services project to identify where hydrogen sulfide (H2S) and other odorous compounds collect within the system causing air quality issues and increased degradation rates for collection system infrastructure and to determine if solutions to these issues exist prior to employing the full battery of odor control mitigation measures.

Project Description

The scope of services consists of professional engineering services to provide sampling for and design of odor control and associated improvements for the entire collection system. The design professional will provide engineering services for the following improvements:

- Develop a sampling and analysis plan (SAP) to sample up to 40 manhole locations that have the highest likelihood for elevated H2S levels;
- Collect up to 40, 24-hour aliquot samples for H2S and other analytes to supplement the City's influent sampling data set;
- Provide a data report detailing the results of the sampling effort;
 - Within the data report, the design professional will provide a plan for chemical piloting and other potential mitigation strategies to employ at identified target locations.
- Conduct chemical piloting and/or other mitigation strategies at locations identified within the data report;
- Provide the City with a summary report of results of chemical piloting and/or other mitigation strategies implemented; and
- Additional project scope that will be negotiated after award will include the deployment of H2S dataloggers at all planned sampling location sites, in addition to planned odor logger installs at select tube pump stations.

<u>Term</u>

The term of this project will be 540 days.

MBE/WBE Goals

CREO KC established goals of 14% MBE and 14% WBE on this design professional services project on July 14, 2023. A revised Contrator Utilization Plan/Request for Waiver of 5% MBE and 5% WBE was submitted on March 5, 2024, and approved by CREO KC on March 21, 2024.

Solicitation

This Project was advertised in accordance with the City's requirements. One proposal from Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. was received on October 17, 2023.

Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. was selected for this project with a contract amount of \$1,105,746.00, with subcontracting participation of 5% MBE and 5% WBE.

The Contractor Utilization Plan (CUP) was submitted to CREO KC for this design professional services project on March 5, 2024. The design professional submitted a Request for Modification (RFM) of the project's subcontracting goals due to a proposed revision in the project's objectives following the inclusion of a third-party vendor, D3 Water. This vendor will provide specialized H2S equipment, installation, and data management services which were not initially part of the project's scope.

Due to this inclusion, the design professional will not be able to meet the original 14% MBE and 14% WBE goals. The design professional suggested revising the overall project's goals to 5% MBE and 5% WBE on the total contract value while still ensuring quality work is delivered.

The CUP/RFM was approved by CREO KC on March 21, 2024 with 5% MBE and 5% WBE participation.
