Purpose of the Ordinance

01

Develop a tri-share childcare pilot for Kansas City's first responders

02

Partner with the State of Missouri and Upwards

03

Provide affordable, reliable childcare to support staffing and retention

Why This Matters

First responders work non-traditional hours: nights, weekends, holidays

High childcare costs impact workforce reliability

Lack of care is a barrier to recruitment and retention

Childcare access supports violence prevention and family stability



What is a Tri-Share Model?

- Childcare costs are shared between:
- 1. The State of Missouri
- 2. The City of Kansas City
- 3. First responder employees
- Proven effective in other cities

Role of Upwards

Administer their childcare network and technology platform

Administers childcare benefits for employers and agencies

Leverage established childcare infrastructure and connect families to licensed and flexible providers

Funding Structure

\$3 MILLION TOTAL CITY INVESTMENT

\$3M APPROPRIATED BY MISSOURI (STATE SHARE)

ANTICIPATES FUTURE YEARLY COSTS TO BE CHARGED TO DEPARTMENTS

CITY FUNDS ARE CONTINGENT ON STATE FUNDS

Ordinance Details

City Manager to develop program with Missouri

Negotiate contract with Upwards

Human Resources
Director manages
funds

City Manager reports plan to Council in 45 days

Anticipated Impact

Affordable and flexible childcare access for first responders at reduced costs

Increased employee satisfaction which supports workforce recruitment and retention..

Improved staffing levels emergency readiness and family stability

Enhanced public safety.
