Executive Summary

A request to amend Chapter 88 of the Zoning and Development Code, by repealing Section 88-335-01-B, Detention and Correctional Facilities, and enacting in lieu thereof a new section of like number and subject matter for the purpose of amending required separation distances.

Discussion

This text amendment proposes to reduce the separation distance from an R zoning district or protected use when a detention facility is also separated from the R zoning district or protected use by the Missouri, Kansas or Blue River. When separated by a river, the required separation distance will be 400 feet rather than 1,000 feet.

Detention and correction facilities are permitted in the R-80 (Residential) and Manufacturing districts subject to obtaining a Special Use Permit (SUP) from the Board of Zoning Adjustment (BZA) and subject to the standards of Section 88-335-01.

Staff recommended Approval. There was no testimony at the October 2, 2024, CPC hearing. The City Plan Commission voted 7-1 to recommend Approval.
