Federal initiative to address lagging health literacy, which impacts infection prevention and vaccine hesitancy.

Applicants had to select a service area based on the following COVID-19 Social Vulnerability Index (SVI) criteria groups:

- √ Socioeconomic status
- ✓ Race/Ethnicity/Limited English language ability
- ✓ Housing type/Transportation access
- √ Household composition/Disability

KCMO's service area is defined as zip codes 64108, 64110, 64111, 64123, 64124, 64125, 64126, 64131, 64132, 64134



#### **Primary Project Goals**





- Increase the number of medical care providers who check for understanding of their patients
- Increase HCPs' understanding (and promotion) of vaccinations
- Build the capacity of the local public health system to communicate effective health messages
  - Health coalitions
  - Safety net clinics/community health centers
  - Social service agencies
  - Mental health service providers
  - Neighborhood groups

### **Key Strategies**

- Public Health
- Promote the uptake of organizational policies that improve staff competency for clear communication
- Deploy health educators throughout the public health system to build capacity and provide job aids
- Enhance skills through workshops/courses
- Partner with organizations who can organize monthly public-focused health literacy events
- Build a speaker's bureau of residents who can extend KCHD capacity to speak to other residents (i.e., clarifying myths)

The KCMO project will *prioritize* two of the populations that are at higher risk for COVID-19 exposure and infection:

> African and Asian descent

However, grant activities will be distributed throughout the entire local public health system

Funding in the amount of \$2,847,052.00 is awarded for a two-year performance and budget period, which is July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023.



32% (\$860,000) of this award will be issued as contracts with organizations serving the focus populations.

Four (4) subawards each year of ~\$115,000 each to community-based organizations

- Vendors to provide clear health communication training
- Quality management and evaluation services
