<p>Reason for Legislation</p> <p>Accepting \$25,000 in grant funding from Washington University to collaborate on the Center of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) PS19-1904 - Capacity Building Assistance (CBA) for Non-Clinical Testing Program Integration.</p> <p>To assist with technical assistance requests related to the 1904 CDC grant deliverables in the areas of HIV testing in non-clinical settings, social behavior interventions for HIV prevention and PrEP/PEP for prevention with HIV negative persons in the Midwest Region comprised of IA, IL, IN, KS, MI, MN, MO, ND, NE, OH, SD, and WI with approximately 27 CDC-funded programs.</p>
<p>Discussion (explain all financial aspects of the proposed legislation, including future implications, any direct/indirect costs, specific account numbers, ordinance references, and budget page numbers.)</p> <p>The Midwest Capacity Building Assistance Network (MCBAN) is poised to become the premier provider of technical assistance (TA) for nonclinical HIV testing and prevention with HIV-negative persons across the 12-state Midwest US region.</p> <p>The Washington University in St. Louis PrEP Program has experience in PrEP implementation and technical assistance on a statewide and regional level with non clinical sites in devising community events, awareness sessions, and robust linkage to care and PrEP navigation—all aspects of the PrEP continuum of care.</p>
